## Interpictoriality

- Interpictoriality is the visual equivalent of intertextuality: it is the referencing of images within images.
- Of the instances of interpictoriality shown here, it is mostly American and British illustrations referencing German ones.
- Could the reference to German illustrations be an attempt to lend "authenticity" to the American and British illustrations?

## Digital Archiving

- There is little scholarship about interpictoriality because there is no straightforward way to search for it.

Digital archiving which groups illustrations according to subject matter allows for interpictoriality to be more easily discovered.
